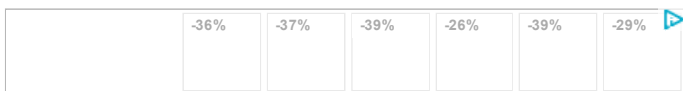

The Weekly Juicery opens with a goal of helping you drink your vegetables

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (WDRB) --The Weekly Juicery plans to help you increase your fruit and vegetable intake after its grand opening at 112 Bauer Ave. in St. Matthews on Thursday, May 22, at 2 p.m.

You can restore good health and vitality with fresh samples of cold-pressed juice, acai bowls and raw food samples at the grand opening celebration.

The Weekly Juicery offers cold-pressed juices, shots, vegan foods and more.

Doorstop delivery is available through its Weekly Juice program; customers can sign up for the morning delivery service.

Founder Kimmye Bohannon and business partner Elizabeth Beal use organic produce for the juices and smoothies whenever possible, and also try to source as much as they can through local farmers and producers.

The Lexington-based business purchases vegetables and other produce from Growing Warriors, part of the Kentucky Proud Homegrown by Heroes program, as well as from other local farmers.

Those farmers, along with Kentucky Commissioner of Agriculture James Comer and other dignitaries, will commemorate the store's grand opening with a "carrot ribbon" cutting and a ceremonial juice press.

Juicing is done by hand using hydraulic cold-press juice machines.

The Weekly Juicery's offerings include cold-pressed vegetable juice in 16-ounce glass bottles, fresh fruit smoothies and raw, vegan foods.

The hours will be from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

During the cold-pressed juice extraction process, the powerful vegetable enzymes stay well protected with little to no oxidation.

The result is a nutrient-rich juice that stays at peak freshness for 72 hours.

The Weekly Juicery bottles its craft juices in 16-ounce glass bottles.

Customers return the bottles for deposit.
